## 1 the original of the species

Oscar Wilde once said "youth is wasted on the the young". Apparently, Oscar hadn't heard about Active 20-30. Since its inception in 1922, Active 20-30 has provided young men and women in their twenties and thirties with an opportunity to become better citizens, and learn to live and appreciate a fuller and richer life while raising the community's awareness of the need to care for underprivileged children.

Active 20-30 came to Phoenix in 1932 when US Senator Barry Goldwater Sr. established the first Arizona chapter for young men, the **Active 20-30 Club of Phoenix #99** (a few other local chapters have popped since, but Phoenix #99 will always be the original 20-30 Valley club). Over the past 70 years, the young men of Phoenix #99 have raised millions of dollars, dedicated thousands of volunteer hours, and personally touched the lives of countless disadvantaged children in the metro Phoenix area.

## 2 it's all about the kids

So we help underprivileged kids. How exactly do we do it? Our activities can be split into two different, but equally important categories: **Fundraisers** and **Hands-On Events**.

**Fundraisers:** we don't run Direct Mail campaigns, or cold-call names from the phone directory, or stand on street corners with collection boxes in 100°F temperatures. We find it much more enjoyable to organize a variety of fun, public events and raise funds through participant fees and sponsorships solicited from local businesses. The more members we have, the more we can do, and the more money we can raise - it's that simple.

**Hands-On Events:** raising money is great, but it can involve a lot of hark work, and take up a lot of time. Since most kids just want to have fun, we also volunteer our time to participate in activities that help brighten up their lives. These volunteer activities include Reading Hours, Bowling parties, Baseball games, and Back-To-School shopping, but we're always looking for new ways to help the kids have fun.

Raising funds may not sound very exciting, but we like to party, and we bring that thirst for fun to each of our events...
